 - 3) Learning disability was evident before the participant was 18 years old
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Proof of the above criteria will only be requested should there WDBS decide it is appropriate to review the eligibility of the participant.

Group 6B

- 1) All participants with IQ over 75 with Autism Spectrum Disorder.

6A – Full criteria evidence

Eligibility Criteria 1 - Evidence of IQ – a full scale score of 75 or lower on a recognised and professionally administered IQ test

IQ test & results

- Full report with test results with Full Scale scores, original signature, date & venue.
- Letter from Professional with Signature & Health and Care and Professions Council registration information.

Eligibility Criteria 2 - Adaptive Behaviour OR Social Adaptation Evidence of significant limitations in adaptive behaviour – a measure of how learning disability affects both daily life and the ability to respond to life changes and environmental demands (Conceptual, social, and practical adaptive skills).

Adaptive Behaviour

- Full report (original) with test results and scores with report with original signature, date and contact details (if this is used there is no need to complete social adaptation).
- Professional Declaration – Complete letter from recognised professional

Social Adaptation (2 areas) (if this is used no need to complete Adaptive Behaviour)

- Special Education: Full copy of SEN including appendixes.
- Special Accommodation: Evidence for this would be a letter from the accommodation provider e.g. Respite care home. The letter should be an original, on headed notepaper with an original signature from the principal; The letter must include the name of the athlete, date of birth, address and confirmation that special accommodation is being provided and for what duration. Special accommodation must be provided by a statutory provider.
- Special Employment: Evidence for this would be a letter from the Employer or Employment provider. The letter should be an original, on headed notepaper with an original signature from the Director or line manager. The letter must include the name of the athlete; date of birth, address and confirmation that special employment is being provided and for what duration.
- Statutory Financial Support – from DHS: e.g. Attendance or Carers allowance, Disability Living Allowance or equivalents. You will need to send in full letters and not just the first page. The letter needs to show that you are receiving this financial support now. Send the most up to date letter you have.

Eligibility Criteria 3 - Age of Onset Pre-18 years - must be able to show that the learning disability was evident before the person was 18 years old.

One piece of evidence from list

- Full statement of Educational Needs or equivalent, including appendixes referring to intellectual disability and carried out pre-18 years.
- IQ assessment carried out pre-age 18 (may be inadmissible for IQ because assessment too old, but could be used in this area).
- Letter from GP or HPC Registered Psychologist, in correct format, with explicit statement.
